

How To Hold Your Ukulele




If You're A Human:


Hold your ukulele flat against you. Strum with the cushion of your thumb.


If You're A Duck:

Hold your ukulele flat against your plummage. Strum with the tip of your wing.

Getting Started

Tuning:

We will use standard tuning to play the songs in this book.

It's important that your ukulele be in tune or the chords just won't sound right.

Standard Tuning:

4th string: G 3rd string: C 2nd string: E

1st string: A

Tuning Pegs: turn these clockwise or counterclockwise to tune each string.

You can tune your ukulele using any of the following:

- a clip-on tuner (available at your local music store)
- another instrument (such as a piano)
- an online tuner

Playing the Songs

Let's use Row, Row, Row Your Boat as an example.

You only need to know two chords to play this song: C and G7!

Row, Row, Row Your Boat


The letters over the words show you what chord to play.


Row, row, row your boat Gently down the stream.


Merrily, merrily, merrily Life is but a dream.


As you sing. when you get to that word. strum the indicated chord once.

Hint: If you see a chord after a line of words, it means strum that chord one more time before going to the next line.




